

Junior Code of Conduct

Walbrook Rowing Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of its members. We believe it is important that all members, coaches, club officials, volunteers and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.

Junior members are encouraged to be open at all times; sharing any concerns that they may have about another person with their coach or, if that is difficult or inappropriate, by email to the Captain or the Club Welfare Officer.

As a member of Walbrook Rowing Club, you are expected to abide by the following Junior code of conduct:

- Junior members must race within the rules and respect officials/umpires and their decisions.
- Junior members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- Junior members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach if they are going to be late/absent.
- Junior members must wear suitable kit for training taking in to account the weather conditions and Club Kit (either junior T shirt or Club All in One) for racing. All members of a crew shall be uniformly dressed for racing.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
